

Everyday Metanoia



Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. We continue our efforts to both understand and commune freely with our Triune God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. As part of my prayer with this Gospel passage, I put myself with the eleven disciples on that mountain and tried to decide if I would have fallen into the group of those that doubted. Imagine being called by Jesus to "follow me"; to live and learn and minister with Jesus for three years; to witness his teachings in word and deed; to stand in awe of the mysteries and healings that

unfolded; to live through his horrific death on the cross and then behold his glorious resurrection; to watch Jesus ascend into heaven with the Father; to be huddled with the other disciples in the Upper Room when the gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out; and finally, to be called to this mountain where Jesus stands before me. After all that had happened and all that I had seen, would I still doubt? Honesty would say that on some days, the answer would be yes.

At first, I dealt with some guilty feelings on this, but after further reflection and prayer, God led me on a different pathway. He reminded me that Jesus died and was resurrected to restore our relationship with Him, but not just restore, restoration with an "upgrade", if you will. In the reading from Romans this week, Paul writes: "For those who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you received a Spirit of adoption, through whom we cry, 'Abba, Father!" So through that Spirit of adoption we have the gift of free will, because God wants us to choose Him, out of love and faith, not blind obedience and fear. God does not want us to be his slaves; we are his sons and daughters; invited to have an active role in making the Kingdom of Heaven visible and real here on earth. Having doubt at times, means that I am always having to discern what God would want me to do based on what I see, what I hear, what I know intellectually (past and present), and what I have in my heart. Being able to choose God, time after time, actually strengthens me.

Do not let your doubts keep you away from God any longer. Come to the Sunday liturgy and hear God's Word and let it speak to our lives. Through prayer and study, actively seek the will of God. By the gift of free will, choose to live as our Triune God has spoken and lived. Allow the Holy Spirit to guide and strengthen. Choose God.



He Is With Us

Jesus has lived his life, died and risen. He has taught his disciples everything he had to teach. Before he leaves them for a final time, Jesus tells them to make disciples of the whole world, teaching all they had learned and baptizing in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

I once heard a religious educator say that a disciple was like an apprentice. A disciple doesn't have to have it all together—she makes mistakes. She is someone who is still learning. An apprentice also needs mentoring. She needs someone to teach her and instruct her, but she also needs someone to show her how to be whatever it is she is apprenticing to be.

We are disciples of a Trinitarian God, baptized in the name of the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit. Our way into the divine life of this Trinity is through Jesus. Jesus, the Son, is our brother, our savior and our mentor. He shows us how we can share in his divinity by teaching us to accept our humanity.

It was by living his life completely and embracing his death fully that Jesus became our way and our mentor. He accepted his limitations, and embraced his vulnerability. He showed us how to live through pain and loss and die with questions left unanswered. And through it all he shared his love with everyone: friends and enemies alike.

As disciples, we try, and sometimes fail, to live our lives as Jesus lived his, but like all good apprentices and disciples, we sometimes fail and have to try again. A great thing to remember is that Jesus is not just the ideal—someone we look up to and try to emulate—Jesus is our mentor. He walks with us, helping us clean up our messes. He constantly shares his love and his life with us so that we can share it with others.
