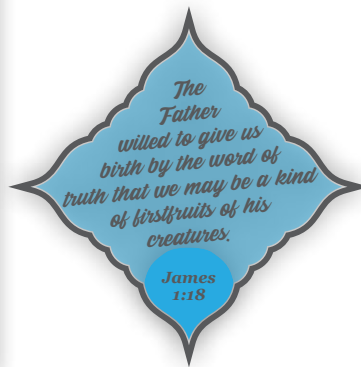

# Everyday Metanoia



There is not usually a direct connection between the 2nd reading from the New Testament and the Gospel, but today they echo one another: that being, words are just words unless paired with good actions. God's Word is gifted to us in order to produce good fruit. In James 1:21 we are instructed to "humbly welcome the word that has been planted in you and is able to save your souls." Kelly Anderson and Daniel Keating in their commentary on James remind us that the "imagery of the word that has been planted recalls Jesus' parable of the sower. The seed of the word that is planted in us when we hear the good news [also] requires rich soil in order to produce abundant good fruit.

What makes the soil rich is our willingness and eagerness to listen to the word and put its message into practice."

In today's culture we know that many have turned away from the church; distrusting and oftentimes rejecting the message. When we encounter seed that did not fall on rich soil, most especially in self-proclaimed Christians, the result casts a shadow on the graced cooperation between word and deeds so necessary for everyday metanoia. This has produced the mentality that "I don't need religion - I can just be a 'good' person." Anderson and Keating challenge this by saying, "The fact that [the word] is able to save our souls - that is, our lives - is due to the word's divine power. Thus, the overcoming of our disordered desires and the salvation of our souls does not come by our own efforts. Anyone trying to live a virtuous life knows that it cannot be done without the grace of God." But we also have to remember that God gave us the gift of free will. We are not puppets living a life that has already been pre-scripted. We need to choose to freely, willingly and hopefully, enthusiastically participate in the good deeds that are being called forth from the word. In doing so the weeds of sin are eradicated or overcome by our desire to do good in cooperation with God's grace.

This is what Jesus identifies in and chastises the Pharisees and scribes for. The very people who have been entrusted with the role of keeping and spreading God's word no longer have the heart of God's word. They cling to traditions and words that are empty and life-destroying without an interior conversion of heart to provide the "why" for "what" we do. Jesus quotes the prophesy from Isaiah: "This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines human precepts." Mary Healy in her commentary on the Gospel of Mark is quick to point out that Jesus is not rejecting tradition. "Rather, he is rejecting merely human traditions that are not based in God's word, that in fact negate the intent of God's word."

This is what the subcommittee wrestled with this Spring as it discerned to answer the question: what makes a "vital" parish? If we follow the Pharisees and the scribes, we would perhaps only look at the number of activities available and the number of people who participate. All Saints could be a very "busy" place, but if what we do is not forming disciples then we are no different than a social club. This Fall there will be opportunities to hear God's word so that we can pray on it and with the grace of God put those words into action in our everyday lives that will invite others to hunger for the same. The full and active participation in the liturgy that Vatican II calls for does not end when we genuflect and leave the sanctuary. If we desire to live the connection between word and deed, we come to realize and live that the liturgy never ends; it is a constant and living fusion of movement between listening to the Word and God's revelation through it in the liturgy, being sent forth into the world to live this through love and deeds and then being called back again for more. The world should actively see that our Catholic faith impacts our everyday choices and behaviors in a very real way. Mary Healy ends her commentary on this passage of the Gospel with: "What is needed is a personal encounter with Jesus leading to a deep transformation of heart. When that occurs, religious practices come to life and serve their true purpose."

Come to Mass this weekend (and the next and the next!) Invite someone you haven't seen in a while. Welcome the Lord into our life through word and deed.

The determination of these men to get this particular man in front of Jesus is humbling. Were they his friends? One could assume so. They must have loved him very much.

Who do you bring? Who is it that you would fight through a crowd, bust through a roof, risk the wrath of others, and move heaven and earth to get them in front of Jesus? Who lies on the mat of your heart?

Jesus knows. He knows your ache. He hears your prayers.

Or perhaps it is a friend? With this in mind, know that as we serve by giving our time, talents, and resources, we are, in essence, picking up the corner of the mat and bringing those in need to Jesus.

# National Catholic Youth Conference



## Considering the National Catholic Youth Conference in 2025?

The National Catholic Youth Conference (NCYC) happens every year, but the Archdiocese typically takes part in odd years. NCYC 2025 is coming fast. The dates for NCYC '25 are November 20-23.

There are three ways for teens to experience NCYC.

- 1. Be a part of the Archdiocesan Delegation.** Parish leaders (paid or volunteer) register their group with the Archdiocese. Package price of approximately \$850 per person covers travel, lodging, registration, some meals, and on-sight support. To join the Archdiocesan Delegation, we ask for group leaders to open a group account with the Archdiocese and submit a no-obligation group size estimate before December of 2024. Look for future announcements in the Official Bulletin and The InFo.
- 2. Organize a parish or collaborative/regional group.** Work with other adults in your parish or other parishes near you to form your own group. Buy your own tickets. Book your own hotel rooms. Arrange your own transportation and meals. The Office of Youth Ministry will provide some tips and tricks to make it easier for you, but you will be independent of the Archdiocesan delegation.
- 3. Family option.** Families can buy their own tickets and make travel plans without having to go through a parish. Sometimes, if your group is small, that is the easiest. A mom or dad with their own children can zip in and out a lot easier and likely save on costs.

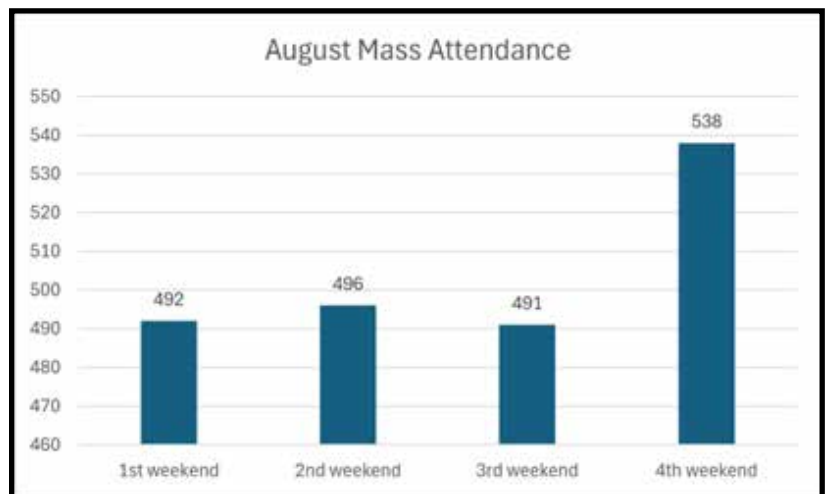
## The Power of One

## Hypocrisy

*The Pharisees reprimand Jesus for allowing his disciples to eat without purifying themselves. They pretend to be shocked when Jesus does not follow the tradition of his religion. Jesus exposes the hypocrisy of the Pharisees to the crowd that has gathered.*

Jesus makes it pretty clear he does not like hypocrites. In this Gospel, he is referring to the Pharisees who are more impressed with outward appearances than inner character. We have a wise saying concerning the same thing, "Don't judge a book by its cover." In the case of the Pharisees, the cover looked fine; it was the inside that was corrupt. I recall hoping the faculty would remember that saying with its proper meaning as I watched my son leave for school one Monday, following spring break.

Peter was wearing knee-length shorts and sneakers with one gray sock and one red. When I pointed the fact out to him, he replied that wearing socks of different colors was his thing. Apparently, he'd been doing it all year. I hadn't noticed because, up until now, he'd been wearing long pants. I didn't say another word. Peter is the youngest of my five; I'd already learned to pick my battles.

I knew that when a child becomes an adolescent, I had to let some things go, saving my energy for the really important issues. I knew Pete was a good kid. He was respectful, kind and generous. If people were going to judge my son on his outward appearance, it was their problem.

I try to remember how I felt that spring whenever I see a teenager with pants hanging below his boxers or hair dyed a bright orange. "Don't judge," I tell myself, "he's probably a great kid with wonderful parents." And I think about Peter today, a junior high teacher in a Catholic school who wears a shirt and tie every day and socks of the same color.
