



Everyday Metanoia



The way that the Old Testament and the Gospel mirror each other today, along with the knowledge that this jealousy still exists in ministry and church life today, had me seriously asking God why He bothers with us humans. How embarrassing and defeating is it that we are still so hard-hearted and stiff-necked? Myself included. But then God's reply came to me. It is because He loves us that much. Just as in the Old Testament times when Abraham negotiated with God to save the city of Sodom (see Gen 18:16-32), we are called to work together to build the Kingdom of God on earth by recognizing and celebrating the gifts in the many that God has graced. Jealousy, pettiness and hostility tear apart the Kingdom. Mary Healy in her commentary

on the Gospel of Mark states, "This is applicable to evangelization today, in which Christians often find themselves in a situation of disunity and competition that hinders the spread of the gospel. Since Vatican II the Church has encouraged Catholics to collaborate with Christians of different traditions, even in missionary work when possible, without ignoring the real doctrinal differences that exist. 'Other Churches and ecclesial Communities which draw people to faith in Christ the Savior and to baptism in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit draw them into the real though imperfect communion that exists between them and the Catholic Church. Catholics...should be careful to respect the lively faith of other Churches and ecclesial Communities which preach the Gospel, and rejoice in the grace of God that is at work among them.' (Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity)"

If we go through all of the Bible and name the sin that is at the root of most of the evil, the highest number of tallies would most likely go to the sinful emotion of jealousy. In the book of Genesis alone it is what led Cain to murder his brother Abel; it was the cause of Jacob demanding his brother Esau's birthright in exchange for a bowl of stew and to the deception of his father, Isaac, so that Jacob would receive the blessing and not Esau; and it was what induced Joseph's brothers to sell him into slavery. It's not just a part of the Old Testament. Jealousy is what created the rift between Jesus and the scribes and pharisees which grew into such hatred and envy that they had him crucified. It was jealousy of the work that Paul and the disciples were doing in the cities that led to the arrest and martyrdom of several. Spring forward over two thousand years and we know that the sin and destruction of jealousy still plays out in our world today.

Paul tried to address this when he talked about the Body of Christ - how we are all given different gifts that are meant to be used cooperatively to build the Kingdom on Earth. One look at the daily newsfeed is all we need to see that we still don't get it. What might change this? What needs to happen? With the understanding that we can't change the past and that the future can have an infinite number of paths based on our present knowledge, beliefs and actions, Richard Rohr offers the following to our present selves: "We know everything today and believe almost nothing. It is not reason that drives our lives, but passion or the search for it. It is not words and concepts, but living images that grab our souls. It is not what we know that haunts us at the end, but what we did not know and don't know yet. We must make friends with the unknowing. What you know is just ten thousand different things. But what you believe is what you pay attention to, what you care about, what finally lives and matters to you. What you believe is not one of ten thousand things, it is that which sees ten thousand things. It is not what you know that matters, or changes anything: It is what you believe - and believe all the way through." (Jesus' Alternative Plan: The Sermon on the Mount)

When Jesus was asked to identify the two greatest commandments in the Gospel of Matthew, He replied, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind...and you shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments." Do we live our lives as if we know this or do we live our lives as if we believe this...all the way through? As Moses declared in today's Old Testament, "Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets! Would that the Lord might bestow his spirit on them all!"

Let's take this question to prayer this week: what do I know about God, Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit and what do I believe about God, Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit? The revelation from this could be the catalyst we need to not only change our own lives, but to change that of the world. Come to Mass this weekend (and the next and the next!) Invite someone you haven't seen in a while. Take the time to introduce yourself to someone that you don't know. Celebrate the gifts we see in one another. Repent and believe in the Gospel.

What is Priesthood Sunday?

Priesthood Sunday is celebrated on the last Sunday of September. Priesthood Sunday is a special day set aside to honor priesthood in the United States. It is a day to reflect upon and affirm the role of the priesthood in the life of the Church as a central one. This nationwide event is coordinated and sponsored by the US Council of Serra International.

It is essential to note that the number of priests and ordinations in the United States has steadily declined in the past 50 years. Meanwhile, the number of parishes without a resident priest pastor has sharply increased in the same period of time. The men who answer the call to priesthood are special indeed, and they are working harder than ever before.

National Catholic Youth Conference



Considering the National Catholic Youth Conference in 2025?

The National Catholic Youth Conference (NCYC) happens every year, but the Archdiocese typically takes part in odd years. NCYC 2025 is coming fast. The dates for NCYC '25 are November 20-23.

There are three ways for teens to experience NCYC.

- **1. Be a part of the Archdiocesan Delegation.** Parish leaders (paid or volunteer) register their group with the Archdiocese. Package price of approximately \$850 per person covers travel, lodging, registration, some meals, and on-sight support. To join the Archdiocesan Delegation, we ask for group leaders to open a group account with the Archdiocese and submit a no-obligation group size estimate before December of 2024. Look for future announcements in the Official Bulletin and The InFo.
- **2. Organize a parish or collaborative/regional group.** Work with other adults in your parish or other parishes near you to form your own group. Buy your own tickets. Book your own hotel rooms. Arrange your own transportation and meals. The Office of Youth Ministry will provide some tips and tricks to make it easier for you, but you will be independent of the Archdiocesan delegation.
- **3. Family option.** Families can buy their own tickets and make travel plans without having to go through a parish. Sometimes, if your group is small, that is the easiest. A mom or dad with their own children can zip in and out a lot easier and likely save on costs.

The Importance of Ecumenism

The apostles are upset. They tried to stop a man from driving out demons in Jesus' name because he was not one of Jesus' immediate followers. Jesus tells them not to prevent the man from working miracles. Jesus tells them that no one who was against him would have that kind of power.

The apostles sound a bit cliquish in this Gospel. They seem to be saying that only "card-carrying" Jesus followers are allowed to work miracles in Jesus' name. Jesus tells them to look at the fruit of the venture, and to remember, "[W]hoever is not against us is for us." Jesus statement serves well to remind us of the importance of ecumenism in the Catholic mindset.

The Catechism tells us that God is truth and love. Since we were created in the image and likeness of God, these two attributes are essential in our own lives if we wish to follow Jesus. Living one's life in truth and love is the litmus test for the children of God. If someone is living life honestly, searching for truth and acting in loving ways, she is on the right path. She is walking with God.

I think in today's world, Jesus would probably tell us to stop being so parochial, so legalistic and tell us to be more ecumenical. God's plan has always been a universe filled with peace and harmony. All people are called to be one with each other and one with God. In God's world there is no place for nit-picking over irrelevant details.

Jesus asks us to look for the good we see in another's life (the fruits) no matter their religion. Ecumenism means looking for and concentrating on the things we have in common with folks. We need to name and celebrate the things that bring us together and work our way diligently through those issues that separate us.
