Everyday Metanoia





This is the second Sunday of Advent and we continue our preparation for Christmas, where we remember the gift of Jesus Christ as he entered our world for the first time, as we celebrate that he is a part of our lives now, and as we look forward to the day when we will see him again at the end of time.

Today's Gospel is from Luke and we hear the familiar passage from John the Baptist, "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths. Every valley shall be filled and every mountain and hill

shall be made low. The winding roads shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth, and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."

Stacy Cataldo, our Director of Catechesis, used some wonderful imagery and examples with our grade school students at All Saints Elementary School this week as she prepared them for Mass. As she began to help the students explore the meaning of this Gospel, she told the students to stand at one end of the room and placed baby Jesus at the other end of the room. The desks were pulled back and there was a straight path from the children to Jesus. She then asked them to think of something they had done or said at home that wasn't loving - like not listening to their mom or dad, not completing a chore, or fighting with a sibling. A few rocks were thrown onto the carpet; the pathway was no longer straight. It was fun and amazing to see the light bulb go on for the students!

We do the same thing in our lives - sins, whether venial or mortal, create obstacles in our path to the Lord. Advent is a time when we are invited to remove those boulders of sin and clear the path. Sometimes it is not always what we do or say to others, but the negative stories that we tell ourselves and believe. This creates valleys in our journey to know, love and anticipate the birth of Jesus - past, present and future. Prayer and adoration are both gifts that we can give ourselves to pause the destructive self-litany and allow God to communicate with us. Sometimes God sends helpers to us, also. Friends, co-workers, family and perhaps professionals. They can help us put a holy mirror to the distortions so that the picture clears, the valley is filled and the pathway to the Lord is made straight. Starting with Adam and Eve, we decided that we wanted to be our own "gods." The mountain of our ego and the hill of our self-will can create detours which prevent us from experiencing an open road to Jesus, too.

So with all of these potential roadblocks in our way - how to we navigate our way to Jesus by December 25? (really everyday!) In addition to prayer and Adoration already mentioned, we are given the gift of forgiveness through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. On top of what is offered already by our Catholic parishes in the metro area, there are three additional opportunities scheduled for December: Saturday, December 14 at 10:30 a.m. - All Saints Church; Tuesday, December 17 at 6:00 p.m. - St. Matthew Church; and Saturday, December 21 at 10:30 a.m. - St. Pius X Church. Apps on your phone, such as Hallow, offer daily Advent prayers and reflection and the USCCB website has a great daily Advent calendar. All Saints still has Advent materials for you to incorporate into your journey, too. They will be on the tables near the coffee bar this weekend.

The Advent and Christmas reflection booklet for teens added this to contemplate for the week: "Advent, in many ways, is a microcosm of discipleship. It is a journey from self-deception to self-awareness. [There are] a mass of contradictions that exist in the human heart. We are lions, lambs, wolves, calves, oxen and vipers. This chaotic menagerie seems awfully problematic, but when we humble ourselves enough to let the little child lead us and save us, then we begin to instead become a harmony of love...Jesus, sometimes I do and say things that make me not recognize myself. Teach me how all the parts of my soul are meant to exist in harmony to bring glory to your name."

An Advent Activity for Your Family

Have each family member choose a favorite ornament and hold it. Select someone or ask someone to volunteer in leading the following blessing.

Leader: God, we ask you to bless these ornaments. Each one of these represents a thread in the tapestry of our family's life together. We gather today to be mindful of how you have been present with us through all our days. We know that you are present with us now as our family story continues to unfold. Help us to see one another as precious and dear, to treat one another with tenderness and care, and to enjoy and celebrate the joy that each one of us brings to the family. We ask you this in a spirit of memory and celebration.

All: Amen.

(After the blessing, your family might take time to share stories connected to some favorite ornaments.)

Now that we've found a smart, simple solution for parishioners and office staff, all that's left is to make sure that everyone knows about it. This is the biggest challenge of the entire process. The most difficult challenge of the process is when calls come in the afternoon before Christmas Eve, reservations are full, and I have to politely inform the caller that there is no room at the inn (see the joke?). Your challenge is to help me prevent those calls. There will, however, be plenty of seats in the social hall. Knudge your neighbor in the pew this weekend at Mass. Our Facebook page has all kinds of great things to grab your attention and inform you of goings-on in and around the church. We'd love to have you grow our little community over there as well. As many of us know, probably by learning the hard way, communication is key. Together, we can create more effective communication. My challenge to you is to help me make this magic happen. Together, we can pack the house for Christmas Eve. Thanks in advance for your help. I appreciate you and your assistance, as does the person that I didn't have to sadly inform that they wouldn't have a seat on Christmas Eve because they were out of the loop.



December 8, 2024 • 2nd Sunday of Advent• Luke 3:1-6

John the Baptist Prepares the Way

John the Baptist, Jesus' cousin, was a prophet who came to prepare the people for Jesus. John was a holy man who spent most of his time praying in the desert. When he left the desert, he traveled throughout the region of the Jordan calling people to repent and change their lives: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight" (v. 4).

God calls each of us to a close, intimate relationship. Toddlers and teens, grownups and elders are all invited to share in God's love. The invitation is extended in all sorts of ways: through Scripture and study; through friends, relatives and acquaintances; in quiet spaces and noisy places.

But God especially counts on parents to issue the invitation to children, to introduce them to a loving God and to nurture their relationship with Jesus Christ. Our church baptizes infants because we trust that children will be nourished by their parents' faith until they are old enough to claim their own.

Like John the Baptist, parents are expected to prepare the way so their children will be open to accepting God's personal invitation.

This can be done in subtle ways, such as creating a Christian environment at home with crucifixes and Bibles or beginning family rituals, such as nightly prayer or seasonal devotions (such as praying together around an Advent wreath).

But the most effective way for children to know who God is and what God asks of them is by listening to and watching the people who are most important to them. If God is going to be a reality in their lives, children must see in actions and hear in words that God is a reality in the lives of their mothers and fathers. For children, God's invitation to a forever relationship is best delivered personally through the words and example of their parents.

The Gospel at Home

This Week's Gospel: Luke 3:1-6

In Sunday's Gospel, John the Baptist urges people to prepare the way of the Lord and to make straight his path. Saint John quotes the prophet Isaiah who also states that the mountains and hills will be made low, the winding roads made straight, and the rough ways smooth. The prophet also says that everyone will see the salvation of God. December 9 is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception—a special holy day to celebrate Mary our Mother. And December 12, is the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe—the patroness of the Americas.

Exploring the Gospel Message

Seeds (**Preschool**): Your child learned that the world around us is a gift from God. Ask your child to show the family the prayer pocket created in class. During the week, use little slips of paper to add to the pocket other works of God for which your family is especially grateful. Take time to look at what's in the pocket and talk about God's gifts.

Promise (Grades K–1): Your child's lesson this week is all about preparing for the coming of the Lord. Check out your child's selfie drawing with John the Baptist from the cover of Promise for the week. Ask your child how he or she is preparing his or her heart for Jesus. Share how you are doing the same thing this Advent. Ask your child to tell you the story of Our Lady of Guadalupe, too.

Good News (Grades 2–3): This week your child learned how the Old Testament—its events and characters—prepared for the coming of the Messiah. The class heard the promises God made to Noah, Moses, Sarah and Abraham, and David. They learned, too, the words of John the Baptist echoing the prophet Isaiah asking people to prepare the way of the Lord. Talk about the road your family is taking to prepare for Christmas this year. **Venture** (Grades 4–6): Your youngster's class learned the role of prophets who preached about God's faithful love. The class also played a game called, "Advent Is a Journey to Christmas." Play together as a family. Talk about ways your family can be more focused on the coming of Jesus. Ask your son or daughter to share with the family the lesson's final page that tells the story of Saint Nicholas.

Visions (Grades 7–8): In class this week, your youngster continued the journey to Christmas by listening to the message of the prophets. The class also discussed ways to respond to John the Baptist's call to turn to God and clear a path for the coming of the Savior.
