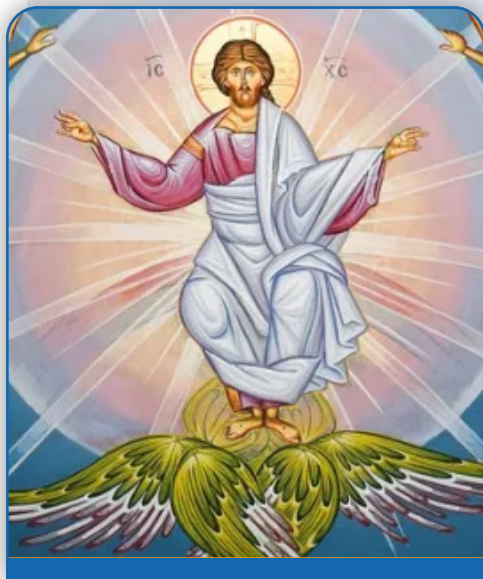

Everyday Metanoia



Welcome to the Ascension Sunday. Traditionally the Ascension of the Lord was celebrated on the Thursday of the sixth week after Easter, which is the 40th day after Easter (see the first reading Acts 1:1-11). The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops petitioned the Holy See (the Vatican) to allow the feast to be transferred to the following Sunday. The Holy See approved the transfer in 1999, granting permission to ecclesiastical provinces within the US to move the feast. As of 2024 there are still 5 provinces that observe Ascension on Thursday, including Boston, Hartford, New York, Omaha and Philadelphia. The move was made as a way to address the declining attendance of the faithful on Holy Days of Obligation. Moving it to Sunday encouraged greater participation.

The spiritual journey and life of St. Augustine has always fascinated me. Most likely because some of my early life was also focused on earthly pleasures and feeding my own ego - much like St. Augustine. But God was always there, knocking at the door until finally I could no longer pretend not to hear. In hindsight, one often ponders the “whys.” Why was I so selfish, when I was so miserable in it; why did I turn away from God so many times when clearly I heard his call; why at that point in my life did I finally respond; why not sooner? As the Apostles watched Jesus ascend into heaven, were their minds full of questions, also? Like our own minds can be at times when we lose something or someone, the emotions and thoughts of the apostles had to be a jumble that focused primarily on the whys; more specifically, why was Jesus leaving them?

St. Augustine in one of his sermons addressed this feeling of loss we endure on earth and reminds us that Christ is always among us as he promised through the Spirit: “Today our Lord Jesus Christ ascended into heaven; let our hearts ascend with him. Listen to the words of the Apostle: If you have risen with Christ, set your hearts on the things that are above where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God; seek the things that are above, not the things that are on earth. For just as he remained with us even after his ascension, so we too are already in heaven with him, even though what is promised us has not yet been fulfilled in our bodies. Christ is now exalted above the heavens, but he still suffers on earth all the pain that we, the members of his body, have to bear. He showed this when he cried out from above, ‘Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?’ and when he said, ‘I was hungry and you gave me food.’ Why do we on earth not strive to find rest with him in heaven even now, through faith, hope and love that unites us to him? While in heaven he is also with us; and we while on earth are with him. He is here with us by his divinity, his power and his love. We cannot be in heaven, as he is on earth, by divinity, but in him, we can be there by love.”

In his commentary on the Acts of the Apostles, William S. Kurtz, SJ says, “Jesus’ ascension does not imply his absence from the church. Rather, as Acts will show, he will be present and active in a new way through the Holy Spirit. God provided that the apostles would receive the Spirit and power of Jesus so that his saving work could be continued through them. We can rely on the presence of that same Spirit and power in the Church today so that through us God can extend his saving work to our generation, also. Because, we, like the apostles have the assurance that Jesus will return at the end of the world, we should not regret his physical absence after the ascension, but focus instead on his presence through the Spirit and on the mission he has entrusted to us. Although we look forward to Jesus’ coming in glory, we are not to focus on the ‘times or the seasons’ when he will return. Nor are we to get distracted from serving our neighbors and witnessing to Jesus by elaborate speculation about how the end times will play out.”

Humanly we get distracted by many things - we are a busy people. We worry about the times and the seasons that have nothing to do with our mission: to serve and to tend God’s people; his sheep. Indeed, the power of the Holy Spirit, given to us through the Sacrament of Baptism and Confirmation is not to compete with God or try to be God-like in any way but love; love of God and love of neighbor. When addressing the Second Coming, Raymond Brown in his book, *A Risen Christ in Eastertime*, echoes this same thought: “It is much more important that Jesus’ followers, empowered by the Holy Spirit, spend their time and energy bearing witness to him...By ignoring God’s authority, human endeavor, no matter how religiously benevolent, will build another Tower of Babel rather than the kingdom.”

Pope Francis invited the faithful to think of Jesus as a climbing partner - not to build the Tower of Babel, but to join him in Heaven where he has ascended. With the Holy Spirit, are we following the steps of Jesus? “Is the desire for God alive in me, for his infinite love, for his life which is eternal life? Or am I flattened and tied to transient things, to money, to success to pleasures? And does my desire for Heaven isolate me or does it lead me to love my brothers [and sisters], to feel them as companions in the journey towards Paradise?”

Good questions to take to prayer this week. May God’s peace be with you. See you at Mass!

With Great Joy

The final three things Jesus did for his friends before his ascension into heaven were: he helped them understand some puzzling scripture, promise them that he would send the Holy Spirit to remain with them in his place, and finally, left them with his blessing.

You would think that immediately after Jesus left them a second time (the first being his death, the second being his ascension) his friends would have been filled with sadness and left feeling lost and adrift in the world again. Yet the scripture reading today tells us that instead “they returned to Jerusalem with great joy and they were continually in the temple praising God (Lk 24:53). So what happened that was different than after he died?

This time, it seems, they were able to believe him that they would not be left alone and that they would, indeed, be given the strength and the power to do what Jesus did when he was with them: the power to preach the good news, to heal the sick, and teach with his spirit of conviction and love. This time, the fact that they could be joyful and full of praise suggests they truly felt that Jesus was always with them.

My husband and I want our children to know that they will never be truly alone, even if they sometimes feel lonely. We want them to know that although we may not be physically present with them every moment of their lives, and even if they can't see or feel God at any given moment, our hearts are still with them and God is still with them. So we developed a tradition. At bedtime each night, we take turns giving them a blessing when we tuck them into bed. We remind them of people they encountered that day who love them and we finish with “God and Mary and Jesus and Joseph love you and we're always with you in spirit so you'll never be alone.” We hope that when times come when they can't see or feel us or God, they will have the feelings Jesus' friends had after his ascension: trust in Jesus although they cannot see him.

FAMILY RESPONSE

Have you ever had a family member or friend die? How is their spirit still alive for you?

PERSONAL RESPONSE

Call to mind a loved one who has died who is now among the communion of the saints. Ask them to help you feel more deeply that they are still with you. Ask them to help you trust even more in Jesus' presence with you.
