

Everyday Metanoia



Welcome to the celebration of The Most Holy Trinity. In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. We say this at Mass often and many say it during the day as they live their lives. It is the essence of our faith and yet also one of the hardest to understand. God is three in one.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God himself. It is therefore the source of all other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them all. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the 'hierarchy of the truths of faith.' The whole history of salvation is identical with the

history of the way and the means by which the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, reveals himself to men and 'reconciles and unites with himself those who turn away from sin." (CCC 234) Part of the mystery that theologians have debated for years is trying to humanly understand the relationship of the three, both to each other and to us.

Karl Rahner addresses this in his book, The Trinity. He posits, "It is evident that the doctrine of the Trinity must always remain aware of its mysterious character, which belongs to the divine reality, insofar as we are concerned, now and forever, hence also in the blessed vision. For even in the vision God remains forever incomprehensible...It does not mean only or mainly that this mystery consists in the special logical difficulty we experience in putting together the concepts used to express it. It means rather that this mystery is essentially identical with the mystery of the self-communication of God to us in Christ and in his Spirit. Man understands himself only when he has realized that he is the one to whom God communicates himself."

God reveals himself to us in many ways, but the greatest of these is love. Self-giving, self-sacrificing love. St. John Paul II echoes this, "A great mystery, a mystery of love, an ineffable mystery, before which words must give way to the silence of wonder and worship. A divine mystery that challenges and involves us, because a share in the Trinitarian life was given to us through grace, through the redemptive Incarnation of the Word and the gift of the Holy Spirit."

As God reveals Himself to us as Father-Son-Holy Spirit, that revelation must be shared with the world through actions. Pope Francis challenged us to celebrate today (Holy Trinity) "not so much as a theological exercise, but a revolution in our way of life. God, in whom each Person lives for the other, not for himself, provokes us to live with others and for others. Today we can ask ourselves if our life reflects the God we believe in: do I, who profess faith in God the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, truly believe that in order to live I need others, I need to give myself to others, I need to serve others? Do I affirm in words or with my life? God is transmitted...through the witness of life." He concluded with this provoking challenge, "The Sign of the Cross that I make every day - does it remain a gesture for its own sake, or does it inspire my way of speaking, of encountering, of responding, of judging, of forgiving?"

A great challenge to wrestle with and to take to prayer. See you at Mass!

Mental Health First Aid












Young at Heart

Jesus Talks About the Spirit

Jesus is about to leave his disciples. He tells them he has much more to teach them but they are not ready yet to hear it. He promises, "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth..." (v. 13).

The bedrock of our Christian faith rests on the mystery of the Trinity—our belief in a Triune God, one God in three persons. For years, I categorized to whom I prayed: praise to God, the Father; day-to-day help from my friend, Jesus; and on test days, prayers went directly to the Holy Spirit. There is no problem praying in this way. It just got confusing for me when I began to imagine each person in the Trinity as a sort of individual power beacon.

Our human understanding is limited, so when we speak about God, we speak of three persons. But we know there is only one God. The Trinity is not like three signal towers sending out waves of power or grace. God's power is not static; it is dynamic. God is love, a dynamic love that is always in motion, always in relationship—Father, Son and Spirit.

The self-revealing mystery of God is like a whirlpool of love, spilling out into and through all of creation, returning in a whirlwind of love. It is in this overflowing, ever-returning circle of love that we find God's power and grace. When we get caught up in that whirlwind, we experience the Spirit of Truth, and begin to know God beyond words or definition. The mystery is not solved; we just get an inkling of our place in it.

Keep yourself open to the mystery of our self-revealing God and teach your children to be open, too. We live in an age of instant answers. Encourage your children to explore and discover the mysteries of this earth. But remind them that there are some mysteries that can only be revealed when you allow them to unfold.
