Updated News - Fr. Eric



Our new Sacramental Priest, Fr. Eric Saah, will arrive in the United States late in the evening on Tuesday, July 1. Representatives from the Pastoral Center will pick him up and begin the process for him to receive a Social Security card. After that he will receive a driving refresher with the goal being to obtain an Iowa driver's license before the end of July. Given that government offices will be closed on the 4th of July, we will be providing the Archdiocese with a few extra days to finish their work on his behalf. What does that mean for All Saints?

- We will **cancel** daily Masses on **July 9**, **10**, **and 11**. Fr. Jack will preside at the 8:00 AM Mass on **Tuesday**, **July 8**.
- We will post daily Mass schedules for nearby parishes on the entry doors for that week.
- We will have Adoration on Thursday, July 10 beginning at 8:00 AM.
- We will have the Respect Life Rosary on Friday, July 11 beginning at 8:00 AM.
- Fr. Eric will be here and will preside at the weekend Masses on Saturday, July 12 and Sunday, July 13. We will have cookies and lemonade after both Masses so that the parish can greet Fr. Eric and welcome him to All Saints.
- The week of July 14 may have some changes, too. It will depend on how much is able to be accomplished by July 11.

As Tracy prepares for her new role here at All Saints those of us in the parish office are swiping various tasks from her desk to make this transition a little less stressful for her. This week, I'm taking away her article so that I can speak about something close to my heart (especially at this time of year), the gift of time.

According to the website, *independentsectorg.org*, the current estimated national value of each volunteer hour is \$34.79. I was shocked too! But who can put a dollar amount on an hour of time given by one of our gracious parishioners who also volunteers their time and talent to a funeral luncheon? No, they don't get paid, nor do they accept tips. Rather, they go to bed knowing that they made a difference in a family's life by making sure they're not labored with the setup and teardown of the social hall while mourning the loss of a loved one. I'm certain that our funeral luncheon volunteers have many very personal reasons that drive them to lend a hand. The smiles I receive during my annual fall costume donation drive are worth way more than \$35 per hour.





You're probably wondering why I'm speaking on the topic of the value of volunteer hours. Today during one of my walks through our beautiful parish, I witnessed someone dropping off a couple of tubs of food for MCO. After they left, I was curious to see what they donated since I know that MCO is currently out of pasta sauce. Our parishioners are usually very good at taking note of MCO's urgent needs and filling them generously. *Shout out to you guys!* I saw what looked like the random contents of many of our own kitchen cupboards. My gut told me to look at some of the expiration dates. As you can see from the photo, there were items dated back to 2009. Sigh. Rather than leave these items to the volunteers at MCO, I took it upon myself to relieve them of the arduous task of weeding out the old items as well as opened items that they cannot accept for obvious reasons. Knowing what I know now about the true value of a volunteer hour, I felt good about taking the five minutes I spent checking dates. I did the same for this weekend's very LARGE pile of Hy-Vee receipts. (Thank you again, by the way, for that generosity.) Old receipts must be discarded and finding them can be a daunting task, especially for one person. Knowing that we have only one volunteer for this task, I find it very disheartening to find old receipts that cannot be applied to the current year's total.

My plea to you all is that we recognize the value of volunteers and the time they give to sorting food at MCO, counting Hy-Vee receipts, easing the minds of grieving families during their time of loss, and the multitude of other things our wonderfully generous parishioners do in the service of others. What they feel upon completion of a project or event is so very fulfilling. It's what keeps them motivated. Knowing the actual dollar value of each hour a volunteer gives makes me much more mindful of how valuable that time is to an organization or project. It keeps ME motivated to make their efforts as easy as possible, so their time isn't wasted. I encourage you to do your part to maximize the efforts of volunteers of whatever project you're trying to help with your donation. If you have a stack of Hy-Vee receipts, please check those dates. If you have a box or bag of packaged food, please check those expiration dates. If you have a few hours a week that seem empty, use them to fuel your soul by volunteering for one of the many things that All Saints parishioners have their hands in. If you don't know what those are, keep an eye on this bulletin, check out our website and Facebook page, or ask me. I'm always glad to connect someone to a project that will be fulfilling to both the volunteer and the organization.

MCO to Participate in Healthy Kids Iowa

Iowa families who qualify for the Healthy Kids Iowa Pilot Program get expanded access to additional food throughout June, July, and August, such as fruits, vegetables, dairy items, grains, and proteins.

MCO is excited to host three distributions, June 26, July 24, and August 28, right here in our building. Households with children ages 4 to 18 with income at 185% or below of the Federal Poverty Level, or who are eligible for The Emergency Food Assistance Program, can participate. This will operate much differently than our regular weekly distributions, as it will be a walk-in shopping pantry. Groceries will be selected by each family, according to their needs. Update from Xavier Catholic Schools



XCS Families,

I hope in these early days of summer break you are already finding time for rest and relaxation!

We wanted to bring you up to speed on a few updates relating to how we are approaching our middle school administrative model as we prepare for the 2025-2026 school year. Our goal is to place our middle school administrators in the best position possible to effectively support their buildings, students and families. With that in mind, here are some of the adjustments we are planning to make next year:

2025-2026 Middle School Leadership:

- Regis Middle School We are excited to share that Amanda Allard who will obtain her administrator license this summer, will serve solely as principal of Regis Middle School in 2025-2026.
- LaSalle Catholic Middle School We are also thrilled to share that Zach Zeckser will serve solely as principal of LaSalle Catholic Middle School in 2025-2026.

As we began preparation for the upcoming consolidation of Regis and LaSalle, the adoption of a shared leadership model emerged as an effective and strategic choice for both schools, fostering collaborative leadership. As we continued to review this model, it became clear that the shared leadership model required too many "asks" of our administrators. We believe that having one principal dedicated to each building will help alleviate this challenge.

While our administrators will be able to focus on their respective buildings, we will continue to be very intentional about ensuring necessary collaboration is happening to successfully transition to our future consolidated middle school. All other leadership roles at both schools will remain as previously planned for the upcoming school year. A decision on the principalship model for the 2026-2027 school year (when we move to a consolidated middle school building) will be made next spring.

We are definitely excited about the difference we feel this decision will make -- and the positive effect it will have on the overall middle school experience for our students, teachers and staff.

June 29, 2025 • Saints Peter and Paul • Matthew 16:13–19

Just "Say" It

Jesus questions the faith of his disciples by asking them, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" The responded that some say he is John the Baptist, others believe him to be the prophet Elijah or Jeremiah. Peter answers, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." Jesus blesses him by giving him the keys to the kingdom, making him the head of the church.

Peter, the apostle who sank while trying to walk on water because of his lack of faith, receives Jesus' highest affirmation. "You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it" (v. 18). Peter goes on to deny Jesus, repent, and eventually become the leader Jesus knew he could be.

Peter is so wonderfully human in all the stories we hear about him. He is impulsive, he blunders, and he makes mistakes. Sometimes he seems almost childlike when he is around Jesus. Perhaps it is that childlike quality in Peter that allows him to see who Jesus really is, the Christ, son of the living God.

Children can be so incredibly honest. They can see right through facades and superficial appearances to the core of a person or situation. They blurt out what they think, sometimes to our own embarrassment. They are as quick to forgive as they are to condemn.

Then, one day when they are eight or nine or ten, they begin to learn how to hide their thoughts and feelings. They begin to practice saying what they know or think we want them to say. They are maturing and this is good, but how can we help them keep the best of their childhood qualities and still be able to go out in polite society?

I think the process must have something to do with being consistent in our patience and love. It involves giving enthusiastic affirmations and gentle, private corrections. That is certainly how Jesus treated Peter, and look how well he turned out—first pope, leader of the church, and the holder of the keys.

FAMILY RESPONSE

Ask each person to name three things about themselves that they really like. Make sure you remind children to listen well. Do not allow any teasing or laughing.

PERSONAL RESPONSE

What childlike qualities to do you need to claim or reclaim to make your life easier or more comfortable? What do you want to remember from last week? What are you looking forward to next week? What are your concerns?

From Archbishop Zinkula

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Journey in Faith

I invite you today to embark on a new path with me—a *Journey in Faith*. This is a call from the Holy Spirit to examine how we live our Catholic faith and how we can best support our parishes, our priests, and one another for generations to come.

This work is a culmination of over a year of seeking feedback, discussion, and prayer. In addition to my own conversations throughout the diocese, I worked with an Envisioning Team, a group of 16 clergy, deacons and lay people from across the Archdiocese. Together, we reflected on where we have been as an archdiocese, where we are today, and where we want to go. I am grateful for their hard work.

Our vision is to be an engaged archdiocesan community of joyful missionary disciples, centered in our Eucharistic relationship with Jesus Christ and united through our legacy of faith. This vision will come to life through our three key priorities: evangelization, leadership formation, and pastoral planning. We must create the conditions for missionary discipleship to flourish, priests to be supported in their vocation, and every parish, school, and ministry to be part of a sustainable and spirit-filled network of evangelizing communities.

In order to achieve this vision and mission, we must address the challenges facing our archdiocese today, which include regional and archdiocesan population shifts, a decline in the importance and practice of religion in our society, and too few priests to staff 160 parishes. The net result of these challenges is that we are limited in the time, energy, and resources we are able to allocate to current ministry needs associated with sustaining and growing our Church.

Journey in Faith will examine the current organizational structure of parishes and schools to evaluate how they can best meet the needs of the faithful and address the challenges facing the Church today. It will be a discernment of how we will move from simply maintaining the parishes we have, towards a more mission-focused network of parishes.

You will be invited to participate in sessions at your parish to offer feedback, share ideas, and express hopes or concerns. These are real opportunities for dialogue and discernment. I ask that you approach them with an open heart and trust in God's providence. I want to hear from you.

What can you do now?

- Pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance
- Stay informed through parish communications
- Support your parish through service and stewardship
- Join a small group or faith formation opportunity
- Encourage and support your parish leaders
- Pray for our Archdiocese and clergy

This journey will not be easy, but I believe it will be fruitful. I truly believe the Holy Spirit is calling us forward — to *TRUST* each other, to *TRANSFORM* our Church, and to do it *TOGETHER*. If we walk this path with courage, with faith, and with love — listening to one another and to God — we can renew our Church and build something lasting for generations to come.
