**Why Should I Attend?**



# Everyday Metanoia



Welcome to the 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. Today's first reading from Sirach is a good follow-up to Dan's message last week on the virtue of patience. Our reading from Sirach illustrates the good that comes from living a life based upon humility. The root of the word 'humility' is the Latin word *humus*, meaning 'earth' or 'ground'. This root connects to *humilis* (lowly) and *humilitas* (lowness, small stature). Therefore, humility literally means being 'from the earth' or 'grounded.' It demonstrates an understanding and a way of living that recognizes that one's place in the world is not superior nor inferior to others. When we live in humility we understand that we are all brothers and sisters interconnected in life. Sometimes we benefit by receiving and sometimes we benefit by giving.

"Though not found on the classical list of cardinal or theological virtues, humility lies at the base of Christian life," Pope Francis said. "Whereas pride and arrogance swell the human heart, making us appear to be more than we are, humility restores everything to its correct dimension. Human beings are wonderful creatures, but we are limited, with qualities and flaws. Humility is the gateway to all virtues. In the beatitudes, Jesus praised the poor in spirit and said theirs is the kingdom of heaven. It is the first beatitude because it underlies those that follow it: meekness, mercy (and) purity of heart arise from that inner sense of littleness. Blessed are the people who guard this sense of their own littleness in their hearts. These people are shielded from an ugly vice: arrogance...Humility is the source of peace in the world and in the church. Where there is no humility, there is war, there is discord, there is division."

Soon we will hear more information regarding the Archdiocese of Dubuque's Journey in Faith pastoral planning initiative. At the September meetings we will see up to three maps which will propose different groupings of churches into a single pastorate, organized in such a way as to have fuller Masses with more vibrant liturgies. Some of the churches in the pastorate will have weekend Masses and some will not. We need to keep our eyes and hearts on Jesus and not on our individual churches. We do this by entering into the informational meetings with a heart and mind filled with humility.

In a 2012 homily, Pope Benedict XVI said, "We, who are little, desire to appear great, to be first; while God, who is truly great, is not afraid to humble himself, and make himself last...Following the Lord requires of each person a profound conversion, a change in his or her way of thinking and living, it requires us to open our hearts to be enlightened and to be inwardly transformed." If the community and followers of Christ in the Archdiocese of Dubuque is going to exist and grow for our future and the future of upcoming generations, then we must, through prayer, allow our arrogance to be transformed to humility. We must remember that all the gifts that allowed us to build the multitude of church buildings now in existence came from God and not through our own efforts. The memories that we have of past sacraments celebrated and community events shared at these church buildings came from God and not from man. St. Francis reminds us that "above all the graces and gifts of the Holy Spirit which Christ gives to his friends is that of conquering oneself and willingly enduring sufferings, insults, humiliations and hardships for the love of Christ. For we cannot glory in all those other marvelous gifts of God, as they are not ours but God's. What have we that we have not received?"

Every voice is important and matters on this journey. Upcoming informational sessions will be at All Saints on September 16th and 17th from 6 - 9 PM. Enter into these listening sessions with a humble heart, an open mind, and an attentive ear. We do not belong to All Saints, to St. Matthew, to St. Patrick or any other single church; we belong to Christ. When, in humility, we know that all comes from God and we live to serve and honor Him through the growth and use of his gifts to bring others to Christ and to serve others as true brothers and sisters, then we will know and experience true joy. This joy will be known through renewed discipleship; strengthened parish vibrancy; priests who are healthy, holy and focused on the mission of Christ; and men and women, willing to nurture their God-given gifts and to boldly share those gifts in service to Christ and others.

I look forward to seeing all at the informational meetings and walking side-by-side with you as we Journey in Faith.



# 2024-2025 End-of-Year Financial Summary


Dear All Saints Parishioners,

The Finance Council would like to thank you for your generosity during the 2024-2025 fiscal year. Please review the comments below regarding our financial results as compared to what we forecasted for the period of July 1, 2024 - June 30, 2025. Questions and comments should be directed to [plc@allsaintscr.com](mailto:plc@allsaintscr.com).

1. All Saints surpassed the projection for budget income by \$11,827! What a blessing!
2. Easter donations came in as forecasted and in line with historical giving patterns at \$40,000!
3. Christmas donations totaled \$66,609 which was below our historical/budgeted level by \$48,391. We adjusted the budget for 2025-2026 accordingly.
4. Financial stewardship accounts for 74% of our income.




5. The parish expenses were below our projected forecast by \$351,401. The following contributed to this:
  - a. More opportunities for staff development are on-line at reduced costs.
  - b. Staff and volunteers provided resources for various hospitality events, which reduced our expenses.
  - c. The cost for snow removal was less than forecasted.
  - d. The Parish Plant Committee encountered many challenges in its effort to refresh the sanctuary by updating the pews, kneelers and carpet. As a result of economic uncertainty, the anticipated income and expenses for this project, which were included in the budget did not materialized this fiscal year.
6. The Parish staff team is operating with 1 less full-time and 1 less part-time staff member than was budgeted.
7. The parish is very committed to supporting the faith formation of our children, students, youth and adults. Staff and programming expenses combined with the subsidy to the Xavier Catholic School accounts for 51% of our expenses.



Thank you again for your continuing support of All Saints Parish. May God bless us as we continue to Love God-Serve Others-Form Disciples.

## Jesus Talks About the Virtue of Humility

*Jesus warns his disciples not to feel too important. He tells them not to recline in the place of honor at a wedding feast. Rather, they should choose a lesser place and wait for the host to invite them to move up. "For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted" (v. 11).*

I took this reading to heart when I was young, and humbled myself whenever possible. My way of doing this was by putting myself down. It took my spiritual director years to straighten me out. I am still trying to learn that true humility is being honest about our gifts: not exaggerating them, not dismissing them and certainly not comparing them to others'.

It does God a disservice if we constantly belittle our gifts. I did that all the time. Someone would compliment me on my work, and I would respond by saying how much better Joan was at hers. It took me years to learn to respond with a simple, "Thank you."

Teaching children this kind of humility is an ongoing job. We often work so hard to help them grow in self-esteem that we forget to teach them how to internalize their real value and gifts. As a grandmother, I confess, this is one of my bad habits. My three-year-old grandchild can sneeze, and I'll start to applaud.

I remember reading somewhere that when a child gets to a certain age it's important to help her begin to critique her own work. Rather than gushing "that's great" for every dinosaur or flower she draws, a wise parent asks his or her child what the child thinks of her own drawing. Just make sure that the child doesn't equate herself with her work. Let her know that she is loved for who she is, not just what she can do.
