Welcome to the Epiphany of the Lord. As we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, I pondered all the feelings that must have been present as the three magi traveled to meet the Christ child. I am sure that fear and doubt were experienced many times on the journey. And yet, they persisted. For many, 2025 has been a very difficult year. I came across this Facebook post that talks about the same fear and doubt we experience, just like the magi. The author of the post goes under the name - Faith Shine. I hope and pray that this reflection finds a home in our hearts and grows each day to replace fear with hope and trust.

## Everyday Metanoia (cont.)



“I come to You honestly, not pretending I’m stronger than I am. Fear has been loud in my mind, creeping into my thoughts when I’m tired, when the future feels uncertain, when answers don’t come as quickly as I want them to. I’ve tried to manage it, to reason with it, to ignore it - but it keeps returning. So today, I bring it to You instead of carrying it alone.

God, replace my fear with faith - not a shallow faith that disappears when things get hard, but a steady faith that anchors me when life feels unstable. Faith that reminds me You are in control even when I am not. Faith that trusts Your timing even when waiting stretches me. Faith that believes You are working even when I can’t see any evidence yet.

Fear tells me everything depends on me - my choices, my planning, my ability to predict what’s coming. It tells me if I let my guard down, everything will fall apart. But faith reminds me that You have already gone before me. That You see tomorrow clearly while I only see today. That nothing catches You off guard, even when it catches me by surprise.

God, replace my doubt with trust. Doubt has made me question myself, my worth, and sometimes even Your intentions. It whispers that I’m behind, that I’ve missed my moment, that things won’t change. It makes me replay past disappointments and wonder if hoping again is risky. Please quiet those voices with truth.

Replace my doubt with trust that is built on who You are, not on perfect circumstances. Trust that doesn’t require all the answers before moving forward. Trust that allows me to rest instead of constantly striving. Trust that believes You are good, even when life doesn’t feel good.

God, help me trust You with what I can’t control. The outcomes I keep overthinking. The situations I keep revisiting. The people I can’t change. The healing that feels slow. I’ve been carrying too much in my hands when it belongs in Yours. Teach me how to release without fear.

Replace my fear of the unknown with faith in Your presence. I don’t need to know every step if I know You are walking with me. I don’t need guarantees if I trust Your character. Help me stop imagining worst-case scenarios and start believing in Your faithfulness.

God, replace my doubt when prayers feel unanswered. When silence feels confusing. When waiting feels discouraging. Help me remember that silence is not absence and delay is not denial. Strengthen my trust that You are working behind the scenes in ways I cannot see yet.

Replace my fear of failure with faith in growth. Teach me that mistakes do not disqualify me and setbacks do not define me. You use imperfect people and unfinished stories. Help me trust that even detours can lead me closer to where I’m meant to be.

God, replace my doubt about myself with trust in how You see me. I’ve been too hard on myself, too critical, too quick to assume I’m not enough. Remind me that You created me with intention. That my value is not measured by progress, productivity, or approval. Let me trust Your work in me.

When fear tries to return - and I know it will - help me choose faith again. When doubt whispers, help me answer it with truth. Teach me that faith is not the absence of fear, but the decision to trust You despite it.

I don’t ask for fear to disappear forever. I ask for faith to be stronger. I don’t ask for doubt to never visit. I ask for trust to remain when it does. God, replace my fear with faith and my doubt with trust - daily, gently, patiently. I place my heart in Your hands, believing that the more I lean on You, the less power fear will have over me.

I trust You. I choose faith. And I surrender what I’ve been holding onto for too long.”

As we pack the Christmas decorations away, considering leaving the Magi out where you can see them as a reminder to choose trust and faith over fear and doubt.



### Calling All Volunteers


## Divorce Ministry



Surviving Divorce is a facilitated, small-group Catholic conversation that is endorsed and promoted by the Archdiocese of Dubuque. The sessions are a 12-week process and are led by trained facilitators using the program: *Surviving Divorce*, published by Ascension.

The local team for *Surviving Divorce* has planned the Winter session: The sessions will run on Wednesday evenings, January 7th to March 25th 2026, from 6-7:30pm at All Saints.

This is our thirty-second session in the Cedar Rapids metro area since beginning in the winter of 2009. We have trained staff members who function as the directors of the program from each parish in our Deanery. All session facilitators are parishioners who have personally experienced divorce and are trained through our Archdiocese.

# Family Ministry

January 4, 2026 • Epiphany of the Lord • Matthew 2:1-12

## Little Epiphanies

*The story of the Magi is a familiar one. Wise men from the East follow a star, believing it will lead them to the newborn King of the Jews. They make their way to Bethlehem, the place prophets have said the Messiah would be born. Once there, they find the infant Jesus and humble themselves before him. They offer gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.*

The wise men headed for Jerusalem, the capital city, on their quest for the newborn King. Imagine their surprise when they are sent to the small town of Bethlehem, to a tiny little house where they find a poor woman holding her child.

I'm sure they must have been a pause before they experienced their epiphany. Then they finally had their "aha" moment and understood. This child was indeed destined for greatness, but he would not follow the usual path to kingship.

The word epiphany means a sudden flash of insight. If we pay attention, life can be filled with these sudden flashes. I remember one particular flash that happened to me several months after I was married. It too involved the search for a king, well perhaps only a Prince Charming. When I married Roger I was pretty naive. I bestowed on him all sorts of impossible qualities. Once the wedding dress was packed away and we were comfortably settled into our apartment, I began to face reality. There were no insights yet, only dirty socks, grumpy mornings and a man who looked rather thin without his armor and white horse. What happened to my prince?

The answer came not in one grand insightful moment like the arrival of the wise men. My epiphanies were smaller, and spread over time. I remember Roger's worried face as he stroked my hair when our first son was born. I can see him rushing into action when our son James fell off his skateboard and lost his peripheral vision, and when his brother Phillip fell twelve feet from a neighbor's tree. I remember the look on his face when he saw our first grandchild.

After forty-three years of marriage and a thousand small epiphanies, I can only thank God for the gallant young prince I married who has followed his own path to greatness.

# The Gospel at Home

## This Week's Gospel: Luke 2:1-14 and Matthew 2:1-12

God blessed us by becoming a member of the human family. This is what Christmas celebrates. The Holy Family and God's incarnation is why there is something so very human about this feast, something that touches us in a way deeper than mere nostalgia. Christmas celebrates God's becoming one of us and one with us. Jesus comes as an infant, placed in the care of a struggling, but lovely family. We are reminded at Christmas that our families are shrouded in the same holiness that Jesus' family is. We look to their lives together as an example of how to love each other through celebrations and struggles. We also remember the account of the Magi traveling to the infant Jesus opens this week's lessons. They honor Jesus as the king of all people.

### Exploring the Gospel Message

**Seeds (Preschool):** Your child will be bringing home new characters to add to their manger scene. Place the scene where everyone can see and enjoy it. Invite your child to move the figures around to tell you about the night of Jesus' birth and the visit from the Magi. Remind your child to thank Mary and Joseph for their sacrifices that allowed Jesus to come into their family.

**Promise (Grades K-1):** Ask your child to show you the connect-the-dots picture of Christmas on the front page of the lesson booklet. Together you can place the figures from the Magi story into the manger scene your child has made. Be sure to visit the manger in your parish church during Christmas time. While you are there, thank Mary for being a wonderful mother to Jesus. Say a prayer there that everyone will hear the Good News of Jesus.

**Good News (Grades 2-3):** This week's lesson focuses on the point that Jesus is the Son of God. Have your child lead your family in acting out the Christmas and the Magi come to see Jesus

plays in the lesson booklet. Talk with your child about why it important that the shepherds and the Magi are part of the Christmas story. Discuss why God wants everyone to know his Son. Your child has made a manger scene. Display your child's work where all in the family can enjoy it.

**Venture (Grades 4-6):** Christmas time is often filled with various activities, and it may be difficult to find time to share as a family. Try to set aside time with your child to talk about the Christmas story. It is good to remember that Jesus Christ came so that all people could be saved. Talk about all the elements of Jesus' birth—Mary's saying yes to God, the journey to Bethlehem, the vision of the angels, the shepherds at the manger, and the visit of the Magi. Talk about the entire time of Christmas as outlined in the lesson.

**Visions (Grades 7-9):** Read together as a family the Christmas story presented as a play in this week's lesson. Talk about why the shepherds were the first to hear of the great mystery of Jesus' birth. Consider doing the same for the Epiphany account from this week. Your youngster's class learned the Greek word *Theotokos* as it refers to Mary. Ask your young person to explain the word to your family. Play the Story Cards Game from this week's lesson.

**Awaken (Teens/Adults):** Discover a new level of spiritual growth for parents with  *Awaken*, the new adult level of the *Pflaum Gospel Weeklies*, developed to deepen your faith journey alongside your children. Scan the QR code to learn more.

### Pray Together

Pick one of the feast days during the season (not a Sunday) to attend Mass together as a family. Use the opportunity to pay a visit to the manger scene at your parish church and pray that you will always be faithful followers of Jesus and always bring joy to the world.
