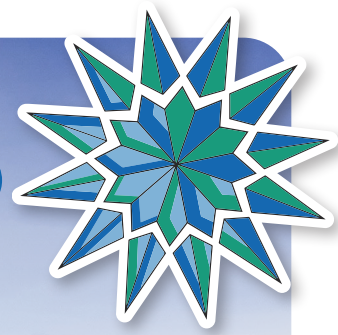

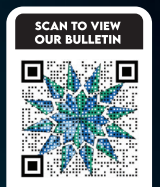

# Everyday Metanoia



Welcome to Ascension Sunday. My brothers and sisters in Christ, we find ourselves still on the leg of our Journey in Faith that is known as the “now”, but “not yet.” On this path, God’s has provided the trees of “waiting” and “trust” as we travel to the fork known as “mission”. While it can be nice to rest upon occasion under the canopy of these trees, we humanly find ourselves wanting to seek and find the warming rays of the sunshine we will call “certitude”. The apostles in our reading from Acts were looking for the same assurance from Jesus - they wanted to know for certain whether or not he was going to fit into the mental picture of him to which they were still clinging. Despite being with him during his earthly ministry and despite being a witness to the many proofs that Jesus indeed had suffered, died and was resurrected, they still asked, “Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?” This is the certitude that the Apostles were seeking. And what was the reply of Jesus? He guided them to the wooded areas of waiting and trust while traveling to the fork of mission: “It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.”

Recently, Bob Lillibridge, our director of OCIA, sent me a reflection by Dr. Joe Pettigrew from his Morning with Jesus series. Joe notes that on any faith journey, “It is remarkably easy to get sidetracked. In our walk of faith and in our life together as the church, we can become experts in things that, in the grand scheme of God’s kingdom, hold very little weight. We can spend immense energy debating...,we meticulously count our mint and dill, ensuring every small detail of our preference is honored, while sometimes overlooking the very heart of the gospel. Jesus offered a sharp rebuke to the religious leaders of his day for this exact tendency: they were ‘majoring on the minors,’ focusing on the minutiae of the law while neglecting its core principles.” Now that weekend Masses and Pastors have been announced, it feels like the majority of us are seeking the sunny part of the path - we want to know what every last detail of the new Pastorate is going to look like and how we will fit into that picture. This leg of the Journey is filled with the trees of waiting and trust and it can feel uncomfortable being here. Our human impatience can take over and before we know it, our ego kicks into high gear and the little person on our shoulder, known as “it’s all about me” is shouting so loud that we can’t hear the voice of God guiding us. Dr. Pettigrew agrees, “This is a subtle trap for any believer. It feels righteous to be passionate about our convictions, but when our passion for minor issues overshadows our passion for people, we have lost our way. The call of Christ is not primarily about having all the right answers or maintaining perfect traditions; it is about loving God with all our heart and loving our neighbors as ourselves. Justice, mercy, and faithfulness are the weighty matters that should occupy our thoughts and direct our actions. Are we known more for our firm stance on a minor issue, or for the boundless love we show to the broken and the lost?”

Sometimes when God is really trying to get something across to us, He sends messages from different sources. What we mistakenly call a coincidence is God trying to get through to us. I know this to be true, because on the same day that Bob sent me the link to Dr. Pettigrew, this also popped up when I was scrolling on Facebook. It comes from the source known as Faithful Grace’s Post: “Lord, Help Me to Trust Your Timing. ...we talked about standing at a crossroads, asking God, ‘Which way should I go?’ But what happens when His answer is ‘wait here for now’? That’s not the answer [we] wanted. [We] want direction AND movement. But instead, He’s saying ‘stay put. Not yet.’ And that feels wrong. Waiting feels like being stuck, like wasting time while everyone else moves forward. But sometimes God’s direction IS to wait. The timing isn’t right yet. [We’re] not ready, or the path isn’t ready, or something He’s orchestrating behind the scenes isn’t ready. And His answer, for now, is stay here. Trust Me. Abraham and Sarah know what this feels like. God promised them a son. The direction was clear. But then they waited twenty-five years between promise and fulfillment. A quarter century of ‘not yet.’ This is where trusting His direction gets tested by trusting His timing. Because it’s one thing to trust that God will show [us] which way to go. It’s another thing entirely to trust that His ‘not yet’ is just as much guidance as His ‘go this way.’ Psalm 27:14 says, ‘Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord.’ Waiting isn’t passive, it’s active trust. It’s believing that God’s timing is as intentional as His direction. That delays aren’t denials. That ‘not yet’ is still an answer. [Our] timing rarely matches God’s. [We’re] ready now. He says not yet. But what if the wait is as important as the path? What if God is working on things [we] can’t see while [we] wait? Today, if God’s answer is ‘wait here,’ trust that. Trust His timing as much as [we] trust His direction. He’s never late, even when it feels like He is.” And God isn’t wrong to bring our focus and attention back to His mission of loving Him well and loving our brothers and sisters in Christ the same way. Dr. Pettigrew ended his article with inviting us to call upon the Holy Spirit to help us see the difference between personal preference and kingdom purpose. Let’s take waiting, trusting and mission with us to prayer this week.

## Metro Catholic Outreach



### What's In Our School Bags?

You may have noticed the numbers at the top of our newsletters include our school bag distribution each week throughout the school year. This program, similar to HACAP's backpack program, was initiated at MCO a few years ago to serve students in need right here in our Catholic schools.

The school counselors let us know how many students are in need of weekend food supplies. Each week, our faithful pantry volunteers assemble the bags, and other dedicated volunteers deliver the bags to the various schools each Thursday. Students pick up their bags from the school offices on Fridays, and can stuff them into backpacks, unnoticeable to the other kids. As you see in the photo, the bags contain easy open protein items, fruit, and snacks. Thank you to our amazing donors and volunteers who make this happen every single week for our kids with food insecurity!



### Help For The Unhoused

Temporarily changing the method of distributing bags of food and supplies to those living outside, this month MCO has partnered with Willis Dady Homeless Services. The bags are still filled and assembled here at MCO, with Willis Dady distributing most of them throughout the week. A huge donation of about 1,500 homeless bags were assembled and donated by Xavier students this spring also.

Today we began a trial system of distribution from our dock two days each week. Helping launch this new approach today are two of our faithful volunteers, Sue and Jan, both All Saints parishioners. They had way too much fun in their short shift, and distributed about 28 bags to our homeless friends this afternoon in just over two hours. These folks have come to depend on us for provisions, a quick snack, and some encouragement and conversation (the folks living on the streets, not Sue and Jan).

## Journey in Faith: Tithing



When pastorates begin in July, it is important to remember each parish will continue to exist. Therefore, your parish will still need to be sustained financially by parishioners. All parishioners are encouraged to use electronic giving to ensure timely and predictable funding for parish needs. In July, money placed in a collection basket should be identified using your parishioner envelope and those funds will be deposited into your parish's bank account. Any loose cash (not in a labeled envelope) placed in a collection basket will go towards the joint expenses of the pastorate.

## Journey in Faith: Diverting Funds to an Outside 501(c)3 Corporation



While parishioners are free to support causes they care about, it is important to be clear that donations to independent nonprofit organizations are not a substitute for parish offertory giving. The most important way to support your parish is through your continued prayer, engagement, and financial stewardship. There are groups asking for parishioners to divert funds from tithing to a 501c3 organization. Diverting tithing to an outside group will have unintended consequences to parish life.

Parishioners are encouraged to support their parish through the tithing methods set up by each individual parish. Your parish relies on offertory support to remain a vibrant center of sacramental life, pastoral care, and mission. These funds directly support your pastor, staff, ministries, and the broader life of the parish.

Outside organizations operate independently and are not part of the parish or the Archdiocese. As a result, diverting financial support to them can diminish the resources available for the parish and people it serves. Your pastor, parish council, and finance council will not have oversight or access to funds from outside groups. It is not likely or guaranteed your gift to these 501c3 organizations will benefit your parish. If parishioners divert funds to outside groups, this will dramatically impact a parish's ability to fund their operations and ministries and maintain parish vitality.

For this reason, parishioners are strongly encouraged to continue prioritizing their giving to their parish, where their support directly sustains the Church's mission and ministry in their local community.

## Metro Catholic Outreach Calling All Volunteers



Can you give a couple of hours once or twice per month to help those with food insecurity right here in our city?

Our volunteer shifts only last about two hours, morning or afternoon, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, or Thursdays.

Our pantry volunteers organize incoming donations, check expiration dates, stock shelves, bag up snacks, toiletries, produce, and pack the food boxes.

Our distribution volunteers add the fresh items to the food boxes on the dock, greet our clients as they arrive to pick up their groceries, and help load the cars.

Our volunteers in the office answer the door and phones, schedule clients for their food pick-ups, assemble and distribute the homeless bags, organize clothing donations and other supplies.

# Family Ministry

May 17, 2026 • Ascension of the Lord • Matthew 28:16-20

## He Is With Us

*Jesus has lived his life, died, and risen. He has taught his disciples everything he had to teach. Before he leaves them for a final time, Jesus tells them to make disciples of the whole world, teaching all they have learned and baptizing in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.*

I once heard a religious educator say that a disciple was like an apprentice. A disciple doesn't have to have it all together—she makes mistakes. She is someone who is still learning. An apprentice also needs mentoring. She needs someone to teach her and instruct her, but she also needs someone to show her how to be whatever it is she is apprenticing to be.

We are disciples of a trinitarian God, baptized in the name of the Father, the Son, and Holy Spirit. Our way into the divine life of this Trinity is through Jesus. Jesus, the Son, is our brother, our savior, and our mentor. He shows us how we can share in his divinity by teaching us to accept our humanity.

It was by living his life completely and embracing his death fully that Jesus became our way and our mentor. He accepted his limitations and embraced his vulnerability. He showed us how to live through pain and loss and die with questions left unanswered. And through it all, he shared his love with everyone: friends and enemies alike.

As disciples, we try, and sometimes fail, to live our lives as Jesus lived his, but like all good apprentices and disciples, we try again. A great thing to remember is that Jesus is not just the ideal—someone we look up to and try to emulate—Jesus is our mentor. He walks with us, helping us clean up our messes. He constantly shares his love and his life with us so that we can share it with others.
